Funding is available for schoolyear and summer programs that demonstrate strong alignment with these priorities and serve students experiencing educational or economic barriers.

Funding Priorities

The Stocker Foundation considers requests that align with one of the following areas:

- Development of foundational reading and writing skills (Programs that strengthen early literacy and reading proficiency)
- Implementation of cross-disciplinary and project-based learning through STEAM (Programs that integrate inquiry-based learning, problem-solving, and critical thinking skills through STEAM approaches)
- Safety-Net Services that remove barriers to learning and academic achievement — A very limited amount of funding is set aside for this category

Eligible Applicant Checklist

Applicants Must:

- Be a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization
- Have an annual operating budget of \$5 million dollars or under
- Have no open grants with The Stocker Foundation (all reporting requirements are met)
- Serve students PreK through Grade 8
- Offer programs during the summer or school year
- Operate in one of the following communities: Lorain or Cuyahoga counties, OH; Pima County, AZ; Alameda or San Francisco counties, CA; King or San Juan counties, WA; and/or Hartford County, CT (may choose only one community)
